CEO'S REPORT

Retirees WA is now in its 85th year!

I am so proud to be part of this great organisation and I would love those incredible supporters from the past such as Theo Kannis and Sir Charles Court to know that their work has been carried on. We are financially sound, have an excellent funeral fund to offer our members, are constructing our 18th retirement village with number 19 starting next year and get some very good feedback from our many members about how much they like such things as the social club outings and their discount booklet.

One lady rang to say that by using her Retirees WA membership card at one of the restaurants in our booklet, she was able to take her whole family to dinner for her daughter's birthday. We also get many members who struggle with the complicated retirement, assets and pension scenario call to say what wonderful service and advice they received from our financial planner. A few people have called to say that they loved the service from our travel agent and in particular, getting picked up to go to the airport and dropped home at the end of the holiday for free. Our social club outings have become so popular we have had to do 2 trips for each one to fit everyone in.

Our Funeral Fund has been going for over 70 years and is such an excellent service to our members. I urge you to take a look, make a call and find out for yourselves, how much discount our wonderful Funeral Directors are passing on to our members.

We have kept our membership down to \$25 by subsidising it to allow everyone to have the privilege of being a member. To give you some idea, a major seniors group in WA is now \$55 per annum and even the RSL has put membership up to \$40. With that membership money we pay for the cost of collection by either the post office or BPay on an individual transaction basis. We pay for the discount booklet and newsletters, both printing and distribution, public liability

insurance and the AGM costs including the morning tea which everyone enjoys so much and we have overhead costs of running our office.

We have had many queries about the allowable limits for the funeral fund contributions so please note that the CentreLink allowable limit for a couple to put money into their funeral, as at 1 July 2016 is \$12,500. It is indexed in line with CPI pension increases every 1 July. Our Funeral Fund ranges from under \$3,000 and can go up to less than \$4000. If you want an information pack, please contact us. Finally, the whole 9 members of the Board came up for election

this year and have returned for a further 3 years with the exception of Norm Carter standing down and Nita Hart taking that position. Norm did an excellent job and will be missed. This group of people from all walks of life and with different strengths and skills and loads of experience are the very reason for our success and they are volunteers.
